

## **BS3 Hedgehog Project: Hedgehog Houses**

Hedgehogs usually build their nests under shrubs, log piles, sheds or compost heaps but you can also give them a helping hand by making a hog house, providing safety and shelter!


Hedgehogs mostly like to live alone so competition for good nesting spots can be high. In summer hedgehogs often have multiple lighter nests and frequently change residence but in Autumn they start building one stronger and warmer hibernation nest (hibernacula) to last the entire winter.

#### Tips on building a hog house:


- Create a tunnel/porch or internal dividers to prevent other animals (such as foxes, badgers, dogs and cats) getting inside.
- Hedgehogs like their houses to be snug don't go too big!
- Avoid treated or painted wood they have sensitive noses!
- You can re-purpose household items such a wooden crates or old plastic storage tubs!
- Make a ventilation hole/pipe.
- Raise off ground slightly (e.g. on bricks) to prevent water pooling in the base.
- Line the base with dry leaves or cardboard to insulate and soak up liquids.
- Offer some nesting material (dry leaves or hay) in a pile outside- if it gets dragged in then you know you have a resident!
- Place in a quiet and sheltered part of your garden, along a boundary, under a shrub or behind a shed, where they won't get disturbed regularly.
- Place out of direct sunlight and with the entrance not exposed to prevailing winds.
- Cover it with leaves, twigs, garden material or soil.
- Do not disturb as tempting as it is to look inside they don't like be bothered and will most likely move on if they feel the nest is threatened. Or worse, if a female with hoglets has taken residence she could abandon them.
- Do not put food inside the hog house if you want to support feed, a separate feeding station can be made for this.
- Have patience it can take them a while to find your hog house!
- Clean out every 1-2 years do this in March/April when the hogs have finished hibernating and there is no chance of hoglets. Don't use any chemicals to clean. Never clean out in breeding season in case there is a nesting mother with hoglets.
